Tinseltown Talks:

Author Laurie Jacobson on 'Top of the Mountain' with Beatles Book

Producing a book showcasing her favorite band was a dream come true for life-long Beatles fan Laurie Jacobson. A celebrated author of five previous Hollywood books, her latest effort did require the assistance of others.

In "Top of the Mountain: The Beatles at Shea Stadium 1965," released last year, Jacobson meticulously weaves first-person interviews and quotes from dozens of writers, agents, producers, photographers, fans, friends, and celebrities such as Meryl Streep and Whoopi Goldberg who came together to convey the compelling story behind the historic New York Beatles concert.

Jacobson didn't merely recount a day in the life of the Fab Four's milestone 30-minute show that featured a 12-song set before some 56,000 screaming fans from the twist-and-shout generation. She describes the long and winding road leading up to

the Aug. 15 event and, in the end, its influence on music history as the first pop concert performed in a major American sports stadium - shattering attendance records.

"I spent close to seven years gathering information and amazing photos - hundreds never seen before," explained Jacobson from her home in Northern California (see www.lauriejacobson.com).


Laurie was just 10 when the Beatles began consuming her adolescent world.

"Like so many others, I saw them on 'Ed Sullivan' and was immediately hooked," she recalled. "Those smiles, that hair! I ran right out to buy their 45 of 'I Want to Hold Your Hand' and went bonkers with posters and magazines - anything Beatles!"

Although unable to attend the famous Shea event because she lived in St. Louis, almost exactly one year later

her parents provided a ticket to ride the wave of Beatlemania still sweeping the country when the group came to town on their final U.S. tour.

"It was threatening rain," she remembered. "So, they dispensed with the opening acts and straight away introduced the Beatles. I watched in silent wonder, tearyeyed, knowing this was my



moment with them. I wanted to soak in every detail and memorize every move. I honestly don't remember a thing about the crowd, just them. Nine 3-minute songs and it was over. The rain was falling, and my parents whisked me away."

Barely a teen, Laurie let it be known to all that this girl had joined the ranks of devoted Beatles collectors while embracing their musical revolution that sparked the so-called '60s British invasion. Sure, some disapproving parents across the country were declaring it's all too much - cringing at the group's moptop hairstyles, their raucous music inciting its liberating social influence, and the near-hypnotic effect on their adoring teenage fans - but her parents were understanding.

"They supported it 100% and often surprised me with Beatles items which I cherished and still have," said Jacobson, who maintains a collection that includes dolls, models, T-shirts, a yellow submarine, rare albums and books, posters, buttons, ticket stubs, and several decades worth of scrapbook clippings.

With the Beatles touring days waning in 1966, the previous year's sellout Shea Stadium concert remained the most memorable, not only for fans but for the band as well.

"Biggest crowd they ever played and biggest paycheck, too," noted Jacobson. "You can see on their faces when they step onto the field - the moment they became aware of their power."

For her book's title, the author even paraphrased something John Lennon later remarked in 1971 about the Shea concert: "I saw the top of the mountain on that unforgettable night."

For those who lived through the '60s, the Beatles provided musical diversion to help survive the evertightening social, cultural, and political chains crushing the country. Today, in a post-Beatles world seemingly also inundated with disturbing national and global issues, baby boomers can still, if only briefly, get back that uplifting spirit their music provoked.

"It was so much more than their music for us - they changed the way we looked, the way we thought, and for many, the paths we chose," explained Jacobson. "Our memories are full of love and emotion, and we have passed that on to our children and their children. I'd like readers to experience the pure joy at the peak of Beatlemania when optimism ruled and anything was possible."

When it Comes to Peppers, Some Like it HOT!!!

So you want to grow peppers and maybe try your hand at hot peppers. There are so many to choose from. Even if you are just buying peppers at the store or at the farmers market it is good to know, "how hot is too hot". The answer is not easy since most individual varieties will vary in their heat content (amount of capsaicin), depending on a little bit of genetics, soil, and growing conditions. We do know that within that degree of variation we can make some good decisions. For example, green bell peppers are always very mild with no detection of heat. While on the other end of the spectrum, the Carolina Reaper will always be extremely high in heat to the point of pain! But what about all the ones in between? Let's take a look at the chart below for comparison. Keep in mind, that some Jalapeño peppers can be mildly hot and some will be moderately hot. The chart will give you some guidelines but how they are grown and where they are grown can make a big difference. Colorado Springs has a hard time growing really hot peppers, but Pueblo finds it quite easy (different location, different growing conditions). Reference the Scoville Scale below.

So what is the Scoville Scale? Here is the back story and some scientific

information. The Scoville Scale was named after the American pharmacist, Wilbur Scoville, in the early 1900's. He wanted to measure the heat level of peppers. He ground up dried chilies, mixed them with sugar water and a group of testers tasted the solution. The solution was diluted until the tasters could no longer detect any heat. For example, let's say you have a chili rated at 10.000 Scoville Heat Units (SHU's). This means that you would have to combine a tablespoon of dried pepper with 10,000 tablespoons of sugar water to dilute

the concentration until vou no longer taste any heat (so a Scoville rating of 10,000). Today it is done with more precision. The quantitative analysis uses high performance liquid chromatography. This method measures the exact amount of capsaicinoid. Green peppers are given the lowest rating and Carolina Reaper one of the highest ratings. All those in between are given a relative ranking on the Scoville Scale.



A little personal disclosure here. I can usually eat most Jalapeño peppers, and enjoy a sprinkle of cayenne on some dishes but that is my level of comfort. For those Ghost and Carolina Reaper eaters...well, you are just tougher than tough in my opinion. Another word of caution, always wear gloves when working around hot peppers and never touch your eyes until you have thoroughly washed your hands. OK now who is in the mood for some hot salsa?

Rupert saw the park bench twenty feet away and shuffled closer to sit down. Searing pain from his left great toe stabbed like a red-hot knife. "Lois, you'll have to push me home on that young boy's skateboard with this foot acting up". Foot ailments are common as we age. It might be difficult to identify a corn from a callus, a bunion from a bone spur. What we do know is—if it hurts and does not go away, it's time to see a provider. Common foot ailments are described below with some home remedies and reasons to see a physician.

Our soles, or plantapedis, medical speak for bottom of feet, carry the burden of our skeletal system. Whether pain sneaks in, or shows up hastily, a myriad of diagnosis can be found. From corns to callouses, hammertoes to bunions, fungus to gout, at some point everyone seems to claim a foot ailment. When is it time to make a call to a medical doctor? A podiatrist? An orthopedic specialist? Ankle and foot pain is not supposed to be normal or tolerated. Pain is indicative of an underlying issue involving skin, tendons, ligaments, nerves, and of course bones. Pain that does not resolve with basic home treatments such as anti-inflammatories, rest, elevation, and heat, needs a medical opinion. Often medical offices will see and treat a foot ailment, but a referral is made when the first round of treatment is not effective, surgery is needed (some bunions) or the foot condition is advanced. It is safe to start with your primary care office for basic foot problems. Read below for most common foot conditions, some you may know, some may surprise you.

- Corns or calluses- thickened areas of dead skin which become very painful. The cause is skin thickening to protect itself from friction or pressure. Removal of pressure and friction are often the solution.
- Heel pain- two reasons for this are 1. plantar fasciitis, which is an inflammation of a thick band of tissue across bottom of foot, usually stabbing pain occurs with first steps out of bed, then eases2. Achilles tendonitis is an overuse injury of the band of

- connective tissue that runs from back of calf to heel-usually resolves with self-care at home and rest.
- Ingrown toenails- edge of toenail is buried in the skin, skin reacts by redness, pain, and may become infected. Common cause is cutting toenails too short, or footwear that is too tight.
- Stone bruises- area between toes and arch of foot may be numb or sharp pain (as if there is a rock in your shoe) may be from wearing poor fitting shoes.
- Heel Spurs- caused by long term strain on muscles and ligaments, arthritis and even excess body weight.
- Plantar warts- highly contagious, caused by human papillomavirus HPV. Those appearing on soles of feet are plantar warts. This virus thrives in warm, moist environments and can be picked up walking barefoot, think gyms and pools.
- Athletes foot- contagious infection caused by a fungus. Red, scaly, itchy, dry patches, blisters, or ulcers usually appears first between toes or soles of feet. See a doctor if occurs for more than two weeks without resolution using over the counter medications. Can spread to the nails, other body parts and even other people.

More Severe Types of Foot Conditions


- Goutarthritis- caused by excessive buildup of uric acid in bloodstream, settles in joints, commonly toes, extremely painful, often requiring prescription medication and pain relievers.
- Diabetic foot- elevated glucose levels wreak havod in a diabetic's foot, as the sugar acts as an irritant to small blood vessels in the feet, and poor circulation combined with high sugar levels can cause severe irreversible damage. Changes in skin color from red, white, blue, grey or black, loss of sensation, painchanges in skin integrity, scaly, patchy, sores that won't heal, inability to walk due to lack of sensation

of feet.All of these require medical attention ASAP, as diabetics, Type 1 or Type 2, may have glucose levels that aren't being regulated properly, and foot symptoms may be a late sign or an early sign of worsening foot problems. Remember, diabetics with any of the following: red or black skin, skin looking infected, open areas that don't heal, pain, numbness, tingling, ANY change in color compared to other foot skin color should be seen by their PCP.

 Bunion A bony bump that develops on the outside of the big toe or joint. It occurs when some of the bones in the front part of your foot move out of place, causing the tip of your big toe to get pulled toward the smaller toes and forces the side joint of big toe to stick out. The skin over the bunion might be red and sore. Most can be treated at home with anti-inflammatory like an NSAID, ice, heat, and no ill-fitting shoes. At worst, bunions may require surgery.

Over the counter treatments may help basic ailments, but significant pain, discomfort, numbness, tingling and changes in skin color are reasons to see your primary care, with a possible referral to a podiatrist. It is not wrong to see a podiatrist first. They are highly specialized and can assist with any type of foot ailment. In fact, they see and treat many bone related foot and ankle issues, the same as an orthopedic doctor. Injury to feet are best treated by an orthopedic doctor. Check with your insurance provider to see if you need a referral to see either type of specialist.






